The Battle of Shiloh

The Battle of Shiloh was one of the key campaigns in the fight for the Mississippi River Valley. On April 6, 1862, Union soldiers led by General Ulysses S. Grant were camped outside Pittsburg Landing, Tennessee, waiting for reinforcements led by General Don Carlos Buell.

Confederate forces led by General Albert S. Johnston attacked the unsuspecting Union army at dawn. That night, after a bloody day of fighting, Buell's army arrived, and on the second morning, the reinforced Union army forced the Confederates to retreat. However, the Battle of Shiloh forced the Union to realize that the rebellion would not collapse on its own.


