The Fourteenth Amendment

The Fourteenth Amendment required states to grant citizenship to all people born or naturalized in the United States, and it promised equal protection of the laws to all citizens. As with all new amendments to the Constitution, the Fourteenth Amendment had to be passed by both houses of Congress. This occurred on June 13, 1866. Then the amendment had to be ratified, or approved, by three-quarters of the states.

The following table shows the date that each state ratified the Fourteenth Amendment. Use this information and the map on the following page to complete the Map Activity and answer the questions that follow.


